The 11th International Symposium on the Conservation of Monuments in the Mediterranean Basin (11th MONUBASIN) is organized by the University of West Attica (Department of Archival, Library and Information Studies AND Department of Conservation of Antiquities and Works of Arts), the National Technical University of Athens (School of Chemical Engineering, Material Science and Engineering Department), the University of IUAV Venice (Department of Architecture), the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (School of Chemistry) and the University of L'Aquila.

Venue and Dates

The Symposium will be held at the Egaleo Park Campus Conference Center of the University of West Attica in Athens, Greece, from the 17th of June until the 19th of June 2024.

Aims - Theme

This International Symposium on the Conservation of Monuments in the Mediterranean Basin (MONUBASIN) has provided a forum for scientists, technicians and experts in the conservation and restoration of monuments to present their work and exchange ideas and experiences for over 30 years.

The theme of this Symposium is:

"Exploring Material, Techniques and Technological Advances for Conservation, Urban Restoration and Management of Cultural Heritage in the New Era".

The new era is marked and characterized by recurring anthropogenic crises (e.g., pandemics, war, migration and economic crisis), climate change, but also impressive technological advancements, such as Artificial Intelligence (AI) within cultural heritage ecosystems. The theme of the Symposium refers to the materials, techniques and state-of-the-art technological advances used for damage assessment, rehabilitation and restoration in urban environments, in the direction of sustainable and long-lasting conservation. The thematology of the 11th MONUBASIN Symposium includes aspects of Cultural Heritage Management related to conservation/restoration procedures and techniques (e.g. recording, documentation, protection and monitoring tasks), as well as the novel approaches for promoting and presenting cultural artefacts to the public and relevant interest parties in the new digital era of cultural heritage management.

Authors are invited to submit an abstract (2 pages maximum) by the 15th of March 2024 and the full paper (8 pages maximum) by the 30th of April 2024 through the online submission system using the proposed template (see here for details) in one of the following thematic areas:
